What is the BCOGC Incident Map?

The BCOGC Incident Map is an interactive web-based map showing where pipeline incidents have occurred from 2009 to present. The Commission is committed to full public transparency and this tool provides timely, factual information on all pipeline incidents.

The Commission ensures companies respond effectively and the interests of British Columbians are protected through a 24/7, 365 days-per-year incident response program. When a pipeline incident occurs, companies must immediately report it to the Commission and take action to safeguard public safety and the environment as part of required emergency response programs. In addition to the immediate company response, the Commission (in cooperation with the Ministry of Environment) takes steps to ensure the environmental effects of any product release are contained, mitigated and appropriately remediated.

The BCOGC Incident Map currently displays pipeline incidents, but the Commission anticipates future enhancements to include incidents associated with all other natural gas and oil activities (e.g. drilling and production, processing, and natural gas liquefaction).


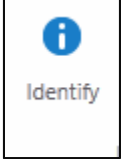

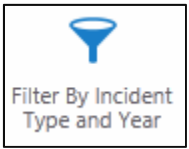


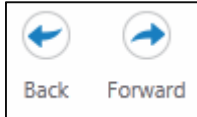


How do I access the BCOGC Incident Map?

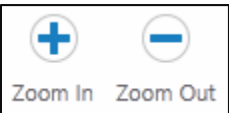
You do not need special permission to gain access to the BCOGC Incident Map. It can be accessed via the following link:

What does each tool do?

- Below is a definition for each tool within the BCOGC Incident Map.

ICON	TOOL NAME	DESCRIPTION
	Disclaimer	Used to open the panel that contains the disclaimer
	Identify	Identifies an incident at any point clicked on the map. You can also click and drag a box around a collection of points
	Identify By Rectangle	Identifies incidents within the selected rectangle
	Filter By Incident Type and Year	Allows you to filter by year and/or by incident type
	Help	Displays help for the Web map
	Initial View	Zooms to the full extent of B.C.
	Back/Forward Extent	Returns to a previously used extent or forward to the next extent
	Zoom Slider	Used to zoom in and out on the map. Alternatively use the scroll wheel on the mouse
	Pan	Moves the map centre in any direction at the current extent. Click on the map and drag the map to move your map window

 <p>Zoom In Zoom Out</p>	Zoom In/Out	Use the mouse to draw a box to zoom in/out
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How do I search via the map?

1. The easiest way to move around the map is to use the scroll wheel on your mouse to zoom in and out and click and drag to pan. You can also use the pan and/or navigation buttons to find the desired location on the map.
2. You may draw a rectangle around the Incidents you wish to view information for by using the “Identify by Rectangle” button, or alternatively select an individual incident using the “Identify by Point” button.
3. The results will be displayed on the left side of the map.

How do I filter by incident type and year?

1. Select the “Filter By Incident Type and Year” button.
2. Select a specific Incident year and click on the OK button.
3. Select an Incident type and click on the OK button. Incident types are filtered by the year that they occur in so not every year will have the same incident types listed. You can change the year selected by clicking on the Change Year button.
