Order:

Pursuant to section 49(1)(a) and (b) of the *Oil and Gas Activities Act* (the Act), I, Jacques Corstanje, order that Canadian Natural Resources Ltd. (CNRL) must:

1. On or before April 9, 2017:
 - a. Minimize the sediment that is flowing into the stream at the bridge located approximately at kilometer 4.2 of PDR 165 (known as the Mile 132 road).
 - b. Reestablish proper drainage structures, including culverts and ditches, from kilometer 3 to kilometer 5 of PDR 165.
2. On or before April 13, 2017:
 - a. Reestablish proper drainage structures, including culverts and ditches, from kilometer 5 to kilometer 19.5 of PDR 165.
3. Submit evidence of completion for all works required in items #1 and #2 electronically to the Commission at C&E@bcogc.ca.

Conditions:

- A. This order shall remain in effect until amended or terminated in whole or in part by the Commission.

Reasons:

I make this Order for the following reasons:

- i. CNRL is the permit holder of PDR 165.
- ii. Inspections of PDR 165 in April 2017 showed that road surface and slope drainage systems, including inlets, drainage structures, ditches, and road crowning are not properly maintained and are not functional.
- iii. These ongoing issues have contributed to sediment entering the fish bearing tributary of Blair Creek.
- iv. The sediment poses a risk to the environment.
- v. I am of the opinion that CNRL has failed to comply with the Act and regulations.
- vi. I am also of the opinion that this order is necessary to protect the environment.

Review and Appeal

CNRL may request a review of this amendment under section 70 of the Act by submitting a request for review to ogc.determinationreviews@bcogc.ca

CNRL may appeal this amendment to the Oil and Gas Appeal Tribunal under section 72 of the Act. The process for appeals may be found at www.ogat.gov.bc.ca and a notice of appeal may be sent to the Oil and Gas Appeal Tribunal at:
