**Authorizations**

**Land Act**

1. The BC Energy Regulator, under section 39 of the Land Act, hereby grants an amendment to the permit issued for the above referenced Application Determination Number, and any associated authorizations, subject to the original permit, any subsequent amendments, and any additional or revised conditions as set out herein, as per the Amendment Details table above and, if required, as detailed in the Activity Details table(s) below.
2. The authorizations granted under this amendment are limited to the information indicated within the submitted application number, including any spatial data, submitted to the BC Energy Regulator in the amendment application as identified and dated above; herein after referred to as the 'activity area'.
3. The BC Energy Regulator, under section 39 of the *Land Act* hereby authorizes the permit holder to occupy and use Crown land within the activity area for the purposes of carrying out the authorized activities.
  - a. The authorization to use Crown land does not entitle the permit holder to exclusive possession of the activity area.
  - b. The total disturbance within the operating area must not exceed the total approved disturbance footprint as referenced above.
  - c. A modification to a licence previously authorized under section 39 of the *Land Act* will follow.

The shapefile and plan must be submitted via eSubmission.
7. The Permit Holder must notify the First Nation(s) copied on this permit/authorization at least 5 (five) working days prior to project commencement.

### Environmental

8. The permit holder must make reasonable efforts to prevent establishment of invasive plants on the activity area resulting from the carrying out of activities authorized under this permit.
9. The permit holder must implement the recommended mitigation measures and strategies described in Table 2 of the Cedar LNG 2024 Marine Drilling Environmental Management Plan (EMP) dated July 15, 2024. Revisions to the EMP must be communicated promptly via [postpermitrequests@bc-er.ca](mailto:postpermitrequests@bc-er.ca) and made available to the BC Energy Regulator upon request. Monitoring records must be made in accordance with Table 1 of the EMP and must be kept and made available to the BC Energy Regulator upon request.

If an artifact, feature, material or thing protected under the *Heritage Conservation Act* is identified within the activity area, the permit holder must, unless the permit holder holds a permit under Section 12.4 of the *Heritage Conservation Act* issued by the BC Energy Regulator in respect of that artifact, feature, material or thing:

  - b. Immediately notify the BC Energy Regulator; and
  - c. Resume work in the vicinity of the artifacts, features, materials or things in accordance with direction from the BC Energy Regulator.

## **General, Authorizations and Conditions**

### **Authorizations**

#### **Land Act**

1. The BC Energy Regulator, pursuant to section 39 of the Land Act hereby authorizes the occupation and use of Crown land to construct, operate, and maintain the related activity(s) defined in the Energy Resource Activities Act (ERAA) as detailed in the Activities Approved table above, subject to the conditions herein.
