Updated Well Classification Process

EFFECTIVE DATE: Jan. 2, 2015

The BC Oil and Gas Commission (Commission) has updated its <u>Well Permit Application Manual</u>, <u>Well Permit Application Form</u>, <u>Well Permit Amendment Application Form</u> and <u>Subsequent Well Application Form</u> in regard to a change in the well permit classification process. Well classification is in accordance with Section 2 of the <u>Drilling and Production Regulation</u>. A recent analysis has identified approximately 95 per cent of current well permit applications are classified as "Development."

In an effort to streamline application review processes, applicants are now required to indicate the well classification on the Well Permit Application Form and provide written acknowledgment that the Commission may release well reports and well data in accordance with the timelines set out in Section 17(1) of the Oil and Gas Activities Act General Regulation. This adjustment is consistent with requirements being developed as part of the E-Permitting component of the Business Transition Strategy.

Applicants are encouraged to use the <u>FTP</u> data source to support well classifications. The "apda" file grouping contains the necessary information required to spatially plot shapefiles and determine where potential well applications fit with respect to other established pools.
