Re: Water Disposal Application
Pacific Fort St. John 10-30-03-18 WGM

Your application of June 14th for use of the subject well as a water disposal well in the Halfway formation has been reviewed. Approval is granted for disposal of Halfway produced water from the Fort St. John and Fort St. John S.E. fields into the Halfway formation in the well in 10-30-03-18 WGM. Prior to actual conversion of the well's status please submit, to our Development Engineering Section, the usual copies of the form 'Application to Alter'.

Permission is withheld for disposal into this well of produced water from the Baldonnel and Belloy zones in the two fields. This is because it is our understanding that the reason for requiring a new disposal well is that the capacity of the present well has been drastically reduced. This could be due to an incompatibility problem. Consequently, we will require the results of compatibility tests between the waters before approval can be granted for disposal of Baldonnel and Belloy waters into the Halfway zone in 10-30-03-18 WGM.
