IN THE MATTER of a Concurrent Production Scheme of Encor Inc. (Encor) for producing the Halfway "B" Pool oil and Halfway "C" Pool gas in the well Encor et al Muskrat 8-27-87-18 W6M with a project oil and gas allowable.

Now therefore the Division Head, pursuant to section 113 of the Petroleum and Natural Gas Act, hereby approves the Concurrent Production Scheme of Encor for oil and gas production with project allowable, as such scheme is described in

(a) Application from Encor to the Division dated January 16, 1992 and related submission.

This scheme is approved, subject to the conditions herein contained and, in particular:

- 1. The area of the project shall consist of Section 27-87-18 W6M.
- 2. The project oil allowable is $10 \text{ m}^3/\text{d}$.
- 3. Gas production from the project will be limited to $60 \text{ E}^3\text{m}^3/\text{d}$.
- 4. All gas production will be conserved.
