
**RE: APPLICATION FOR SALT WATER DISPOSAL

IN THE MATTER of a scheme of Amoco Canada Resources Ltd. for Salt Water Disposal (SWD) in the Baldonnel Formation in the well Amoco Cypress a-86-C/94-B-15 (W.A. 827).

The Ministry of Energy, Mines and Petroleum Resources, pursuant to section 116 of the Petroleum and Natural Gas Act, hereby orders as follows:

1. The SWD scheme of Amoco Canada Resources Ltd. (operator) for disposal of produced water into the Baldonnel Formation at well a-86-C/94-B-15 as such scheme is described in the application from the operator to the ministry dated March 16, 1993, is hereby approved, subject to the terms and conditions herein contained.
2. Only produced water from the Cypress Baldonnel will be disposed of in the well.
3. The water disposal interval must be in the Baldonnel Formation.
4. A record of the source of water and volumes disposed of through this well should be included on a Monthly Injection/Disposal Statement. The statement should be submitted to the Victoria office not later than the 25th day of the month following the reported month.
5. The well head disposal/injection pressure must not exceed the formation fracture pressure.
6. This approval may be modified or rescinded at a later date if deemed appropriate through a change in circumstances.
