

PETROLEUM AND NATURAL GAS ACT (the "Act")
THE PROVINCE OF BRITISH COLUMBIA

ENERGY RESOURCES DIVISION

IN THE MATTER of a scheme of Canadian Natural Resources Limited (the "Operator") for Salt Water Disposal (SWD) in the Bluesky Formation in the well CNRL Drake b-84-E/94-H-1.

The Minister of Energy, Mines and Petroleum Resources, pursuant to section 116 of the Act, hereby orders as follows:

1. The SWD scheme of the Operator for disposal of produced water in the Bluesky Formation at well b-84-E/94-H-1 as such scheme is described in the application from the Operator to the ministry dated May 18, 1994, is hereby approved, subject to terms and conditions herein contained.
2. The water disposal interval must be in the Bluesky Formation.
3. A record of volume of salt water disposed of through this well must be included on a Monthly Injection/Disposal Statement, in the prescribed form, which should be submitted to the Energy Resources Division not later than the 25th day of the month following the reported month.
4. The well head disposal/injection pressure must not exceed the formation fracture pressure.
5. This approval may be modified or rescinded at a later date if deemed appropriate through a change in circumstances.
